

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INTRODUCTION TO NEED TO KNOW SERIES

You can study the Bible for your entire life and never begin to master all that it teaches. 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LESSON ONE: THE WORD OF GOD

INTRODUCTION

If we are going to center our lives on the teachings of the Bible, it only makes sense to talk about what the Bible is, what makes it unique, why we believe it, and how it came about. In this section we will discuss what it means that the Bible is inspired and without error, and what it doesn't mean. We will also talk about some of the difficulties with the Bible and why it is so important that we can trust it.

EPISTEMOLOGY-WHAT IS TRUTH?

"Inerrancy means that when all facts are known, the Scriptures ir their original autographs and properly interpreted will be shown to be wholly true in everything that they affirm, whether that has to do with doctrine or morality or with the social, physical or life sciences."
*Inerrancy is related to the <u>intention</u> of Scripture.

MISUNDERSTANDINGS OF INERRANCY-

- 1. Doesn't demand strict adherence to rules of grammar.
- 2. Doesn't preclude use of figures of speech or literary genre.
- 3. Doesn't demand historical or semantic precision.
- 4. Doesn't demand technical language of modern science.
- 5. Doesn't require verbal exactness when quoting OT in NT.
- 6. Doesn't demand that sayings of Jesus be precise quotes, but just accurate content.
- 7. Doesn't guarantee comprehensiveness of any one account.
- 8. Doesn't demand infallibility of ever source used by writers.

CANONICITY-

If any errors, the Bible becomes subject to human judgement. (Practical inerrancy.)

Humble hermeneutics (The Bible is inerrant. We are not!)

LESSON TWO: CREATION AND THE FALL

INTRODUCTION
In this chapter we will look at what the Bible teaches about how our world got here and what were the origins of mankind. We will also look at what it tells us about what went wrong. If we were created by God with a purpose, or if we are the product of random evolutionary luck, the ramifications to us are huge if we are trying to understand the meaning of our lives. Our life's meaning and significance then has a significant impact on how we live our lives, and on what we value. The very first line of the Bible says, "In the beginning God created" How we understand that sets the stage for everything that follows.

LESSON THREE: GOD AND THE TRINITY

INTRODUCTION

The Bible presents God as a triune Being. This is one of the most difficult concepts to grasp about God. But the Bible teaches that there is one God, eternally existent in three distinct persons. This is one of those things about God that reminds us that He is bigger, greater and more complex than we are. As soon as we think we understand the Trinity, we are probably falling into false teaching, as we attempt to simplify a complex God. But even though we don't completely grasp this baffling concept, we can still appreciate the glory of our great God!

INTRODUCTION

The Old Testament records how God reached out to people to help them understand their need for Him. He did this by communicating life on a high moral plane through a lengthy list of ceremonial and moral regulations called The Law, or Torah. The first five books of the Bible constitute collectively the Law. Most of the actual regulations of the Law are found in the Books of Exodus, Leviticus and Deuteronomy. The primary purpose of the Law was to let us know how far we are from meeting the righteous standards of God. Jesus said the Law would be fulfilled if we just loved God and loved people more.


